## A Message from Pastor Justin

I look forward to many more years with you as we grow together into what Christ desires us to be. As practice continues for this year's Christmas play I am thinking back to last year's play. It

It is so easy for us to get caught up in the busyness of Christmas that we lose sight of what it is all about. God truly does want you for Christmas.
